Please let this tragic accident be a reminder to all of us about how as adults we must act responsibility when driving in and around school grounds. I never want to be in the position of delivering such heart-breaking news to our community, so with this in mind please -

- slow down,
- be aware,
- only park in designated parking spots.

Parking on grass verges and across footpaths is strictly **prohibited**. Yes, there may be times where you cannot park and may need to park off site but this is a far better option than parking irresponsibly and potentially causing an accident.


Please help us to provide a safe environment for our children as we send our thoughts and wishes to the family of the student who is still in Starship Hospital.



IMPORTANT - GATES AT GHS

We have some children with additional needs that involve them potentially leaving the school grounds. We are working with the Ministry of Education to erect some permanent new fencing and gates to our school grounds. However, a temporary solution has only just arrived this afternoon at school (with no prior notice). This is by no means perfect, and causes great inconvenience, but it is what we have for now.

With this in mind, we are asking that you change your routine slightly and now use either the back entrance or the wide gate entrance at the front of the school between 8.30 and 9.00am /2.45pm and 3.15pm. This is where we will be meeting and greeting for the foreseeable future. We ask that you only use the main entrance at the front of the school as a last resort as there is a step up to navigate and a height restriction,





Please only use this entrance between 9.00am and 2.45pm when the other front gate and back gate will be closed.











Please use this front gate between 8.30am and 9.00am / 2.45pm and 3.15pm.



Please note this gate will be open at the back of the school between 8.30 and 9.00am and 2.45pm and 3.45pm. It will be closed at all other times.

Please work with us as we are trying to keep all of our children safe. I will keep you informed when news arrives about a more permanent solution.

PURAPURA WHANAU

NEW ENTRANT/YEAR 1 (Gill Steel & Abi Copley)

Another great week with our tamariki, and it's so lovely to see how well they've hit their stride with our school values as we steam through Term 1!

A few reminders this week:

Life Education: We are so excited to be welcoming the Life Education Trust to our school in Term 2. Harold the Giraffe and his special truck, filled with interactive resources and a beautiful learning environment, provides children with a fantastic programme that focuses on the NZ Health Curriculum. The lessons deal with a range of topics from food & nutrition, to emotions and friendships. There is a small cost to our families for this experience, at just \$6 per child. This is payable through the School Shop.

Home-learning: The children in our whanau all have home-learning challenges that support their in-class teaching throughout the week, and many children bring home a poem on a Friday for some weekend reading together. We appreciate your support in helping your child to complete these tasks and in making sure any books are returned to school in your child's book bag daily.

YEAR 2 (Melissa Stilwell Year Group Leader)

JUMPERS/JERSEYS - We are currently having a few issues with children wearing the wrong jersey home. At the end of the day they see a jumper, it looks the right size and so they put it on. Thank you to the parents who are noticing and returning them the next day. In regards to this, can we please ask that **all jerseys are clearly named** with your child's name. If you buy a second hand uniform or have a uniform passed down from an older sibling- can you make sure that uniform is renamed.

Term 2 - We are excited to welcome the life education trust caravan and Harold to Gulf Harbour School for our Purapura students from May 26th to May 31st at a cost of \$6 per child. The Life Education caravan runs programmes based on lessons that could cover content across five major strands: food and nutrition, human biology, relationships & communities, identity & resilience and substances. The Life Education Trust works on a shared planning approach with schools to create individualised programmes that work for the age level and needs of the students they visit. Our topics may include "What are feelings", 'What is the importance of kindness' and 'What do we need to know about the food we eat'. Topics based on online interactions and substances will not be used with our Purapura students. The exact content will be shared with you nearer the visit in May. In the meantime we are collecting donations from you of \$6 towards the cost of the visit. Unfortunately, if the school does not have enough parent support with the cost of this event then we will have to cancel the programme.











TEINA WHANAU

YEAR 3/4 (Rebecca Wong & Hayley Brass Year Group Leaders)

The Teina Whanau have enjoyed another exciting week of learning. Our writing has focussed around our visit from the police officers last week and our recount writing skills are starting to develop. We were lucky enough to have a talk by Jenny Hanwell from Forest & Bird who is the Project Manager for the Pest Free Hibiscus Coast Project. She talked to the children about our amazing native wildlife and how we can protect it by trapping pest animals in our backyards. The project has free, humane tested, pet-safe rat traps available for anyone in the school who would like one. The only "catch" is you just need to register your trap online and record when you catch a rat, full instructions will be provided. To order please complete this form and the project team will contact you to arrange a date for you to collect the trap.

Home learning - Home learning books go home each Monday and children need to return them every Friday for marking. Home learning consists of number knowledge practice, Steps, and reading. Reading may consist of school made reading books, readers, or school journals. Some children bring books home every night while others are expected to read their own books from home or from the library on some nights. Waka challenges will be sent home next week and are optional.

YEAR 5 (Ruth Trevathan Year Group Leader)

This week we have started to explore the creatures who live in and around our oceans. We are learning about living things and how scientists group them.

Reminders:
