WHOLE SCHOOL NEWSLETTER TERM 2, WEEK 7

Kia ora,

We have had a great week of learning and our children are all truly settled back into their familiar school routine. Washing hands and not invading someone's personal space is now just the new normal for our children and our staff have been amazing at embedding these measures. We would also like to thank you all for continuing to respect our alert level 2 rules. Limiting the number of adults on site is not only keeping our children safe but also allowing them to start school in a calm and responsible manner.

COVID-19 UPDATE

It is exciting to note that there have been no new incidences of COVID-19 cases for several days. However, as you will be aware the government has announced that alert level 2 measures will continue for another four weeks.

At Gulf Harbour School we continue to be committed to maintaining the health and safety of our community and so will be continuing with our alert level 2 measures. Our COVID-19 procedures are underpinned by the Ministry of Education's three guidelines of safe practices:

- reduce the risk of someone getting infected in the first place.
- ensure we can identify and contact anyone who becomes infected.
- understand that Level 2 is not business as usual.

ALERT LEVEL 2 AT GHS FOR THE NEXT 4 WEEKS

1. Maintain Effective and Safe Hygiene Procedures

Regular washing and drying of hands and good cough and sneeze etiquette remain fundamental to preventing the spread of an illness such as colds, flu and COVID-19. This will continue to be encouraged by all staff. Children will need to continue to bring in their own hand sanitiser, handee towel or face cloth.

2. Ensure people with COVID-19 symptoms stay away from school

Any children, young people and staff should stay at home if they are sick or should be sent home immediately if they show any symptoms.

3. Maintain Physical Distancing

Young people and staff maintain a distance so that they are not breathing on or touching each other (where possible).

No sharing of food or drinks is permitted. This includes birthday celebrations. Labelled drink bottles are necessary to avoid drinking from water fountains.

Minimise gatherings and minimise proximity of large numbers of people where possible. There will be no full school assemblies for Term 2. Face-to-face community gatherings are postponed or cancelled under Alert Level 2.

Only year level assemblies can take place from 2nd June.









4. Contact tracing and minimising contact with adults outside of the GHS school bubble

The school will keep track of people who enter the school site – through the visitor register at the office and contact tracing registers all Year 1 and 2 teachers have. In the event of a confirmed transmission within the GHS community, it is essential to be able to track the extent of transmission.

All visitors are required to sign in at reception.

Parents are to continue to communicate through phone or email and avoid coming onto the site unless essential.

Only Year 1 and 2 parents permitted on site unless urgent need or planned meeting.

Start and end of day arrangements to continue with the school opening at 8.30am. Year 1 and 2 children can be collected from 2.45pm; Year 3 and 4 from 2.55pm and Year 5 and 6 at 3.00pm. All adults must always maintain physical distancing guidelines when waiting at collection points. Everyone is requested to leave school by 3.10 pm daily (except those attending our on site after school care facility).

5. Reported Cases of COVID-19 in the GHS Community

In the event of a reported case of a parent, staff member or student, Gulf Harbour School leadership will liaise with the Ministry of Education and Health and enforce a mandatory 72-hour shutdown of the school.

In the event of this we would keep you fully informed at every stage.

Please inform the office if you or your child are awaiting a COVID-19 test.

CHANGES TO ALERT LEVEL 2 MEASURES (as of June 2nd)

- Sport practices, Thinking Caps, Spanish lessons and itinerant music lessons can resume.
- Reading books and library books can now be issued.
- Year level assemblies can take place (no more than 100 gathering), following distancing guidelines.
- Whole school playtimes can resume.

COMMON SENSE PREVAILS

We are working hard to ensure we have thorough procedures in place to protect the community but these can only go so far. Staff and parents must engage in common-sense decision making, while at all times attempting to maintain the safe practice guidelines.


HERO
