SCHOOL BUS UPDATE - IMPORTANT

We received the following update from Bayes Coachline today:

We have ramped up our cleaning on the buses, we are using Dettol wipes on handrails and surfaces each day, and also spraying a Dettol spray though the buses, in order to try and kill any bugs which may be around. However getting more stock to continue this is now an issue...

We have also installed hand sanitiser units at the depot for drivers to use each time they pass them.

Another change put in place by Auckland Transport is as from Monday next week there will not be any "cash" accepted on the buses, this is to decrease the contact between customers and drivers, with the aim to keep our drivers healthy, so they can continue driving the buses.


NEW ENTRANT/YEAR 1 (Gill Steel Year Group Leader)

<u>Hand Towels</u> Thank you to everyone for sending these in. If possible it would be easier for little children to have either a hand towel or flannels. If these could be named it would be much appreciated.

YEAR 2 (Melissa Stilwell Year Group Leader)

Some parents have asked if we could explain how the Reading Colour Wheel works. You may have noticed that some books have a coloured wheel on that back. This is to show which reading level the book is aimed at. The colour wheel begins at the top, at magenta where the books are simple and repetitive, and move through red, yellow, blue, green, orange, turquoise, purple to gold. Each colour gets slightly longer and more complex.





We have also had a few questions about reading levels and grouping this year so we thought we would clarify how we run our programmes and what our expectations are for the year. Groupings









are flexible and are often changed with ongoing testing and your child may not remain in the same group at all times.

Children will not always have a new book each day. We often work on a two day cycle where the child reads the text at school in a guided session (so when they read at home it may seem easy) and on the second day we work on understanding new vocabulary and comprehension, phrasing and fluency.

Some children are still learning alphabet letters, sounds and basic sight words and may have sight words to practice each night until mastered.

Other children are developing their understanding and comprehension. To improve depth and greater understanding of the text the children move more slowly through the colour wheel. These children may not always read with the teacher each day as they are working on independent tasks. Children within these levels may bring home a chapter book from the library which they are also able to read at home.

All children are learning to read with a smooth, fluent and expressive voice. When reading at home please model this to your child, bringing their attention to punctuation.
